What is Grace Place Retreat Ministries?

For the past decade, Grace Place Ministries has been offering life-transforming weeklong retreats for church workers. These five-day events are designed to address the stresses faced by those in non-ordained ministry that threaten to destroy the joy and even the effectiveness of service. These same stresses often drive DCEs and other church professionals out of public ministry of the Church.

Grace Place focuses on the major causes for church worker burnout like poor physical, emotional, relational, and spiritual health; fiscal instability; congregation-DCE or pastor-DCE conflict; and excessive demands by congregations that go beyond the “call of duty.”
